

## Policy for Disabled-friendly, barrier free environment.

### Purpose:

The Constitution of India applies uniformly to every legal citizen of India, whether they are healthy or disabled in any way (physically or mentally) and hence it is applicable to the field of education as well. Although the number of disabled students admitted to the Institute is not significant, being committed to provide equal opportunity to every Indian citizen Institute has framed the following policy for a disabled-friendly and barrier free environment.

### Policy Statement:

To provide equal opportunity to divyangan students in admission and to provide a barrier-free environment to all physically challenged persons.

### Scope:

1. Admission.
2. Administration.
3. Infrastructur.

### The Policy:

- a) **Admission:** Entire admission process for the MBA program is conducted by CET cell, Directorate of Technical Education, Mumbai and they have their own mechanism to provide equal opportunities to the persons with disabilities. Institute level admissions are purely done on merit basis of applicants who applied for the Institute level admission quota.
- b) **Administrative assistance:** Institute should provide administrative assistance to the persons with disabilities so that no such student should miss an opportunity of availing scholarships, freeships or any other financial benefit offered by Government and non-government organisations. All such students should be informed immediately about the scholarship / freeships after the notice of submission of application is issued by the concerned department. The institute must have a separate cell to take care of all such activities.
- c) **Infrastructure:** Institute must create all necessary infrastructural facilities so that the persons with disability won't find any difficulty in moving in and around the campus, to access academic and infrastructural facilities such as Library, classrooms, tutorial rooms, computer centre, administrative services, toilets, corridors etc.
