Intellectual property rights are the rights given to persons over the creations of their minds. They usually give the creator an exclusive right over the use of his/her creation for a certain period of time.




There was a quiz for the participants based on their learning from the webinar, at the end of the detailed information which was given by Ms. Ujjwal Singh.


















Geographical Indications;

- A geographical indication (GI) is a sign used on goods that have a specific geographical origin and possess qualities or a reputation that is solely due to the place of origin.
- A geographical indication (GI) is a name or sign used on certain products which corresponds to a specific geographical location or origin (e.g. a town, region, or country)
- o Such goods enjoy an advantage over competing goods solely because of their geographical origin, which thus becomes a kind of IP and is protected.



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What is Patent ?

Patent is an Intellectual property right relating to inventions. It is an exclusive and monopoly right granted to the inventor by the government to use the patented invention for a limited period of time (20 Years) , thus preventing others from making, using, importing or selling in exchange of full disclosure of his invention.

Basic requirements for getting patent

- 1) Novelty
- 2) Inventive Step
- 3) Industrial Applicability









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
