Intellectual property rights are the rights given to persons over the creations of their minds. They usually give the creator an exclusive right over the use of his/her creation for a certain period of time.

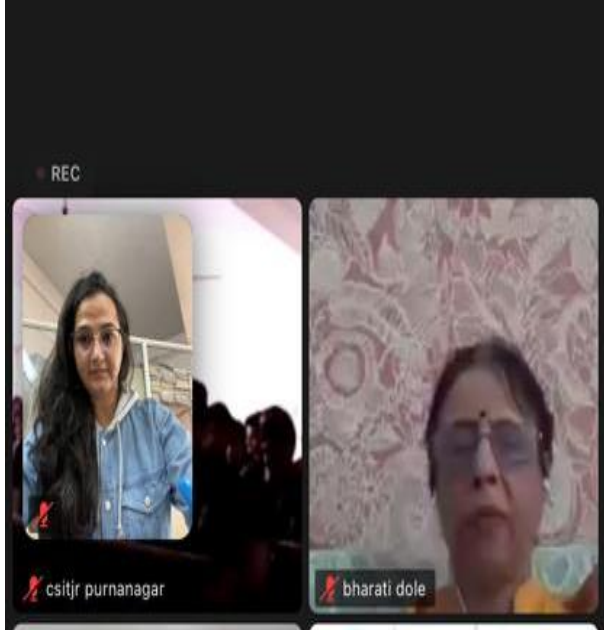
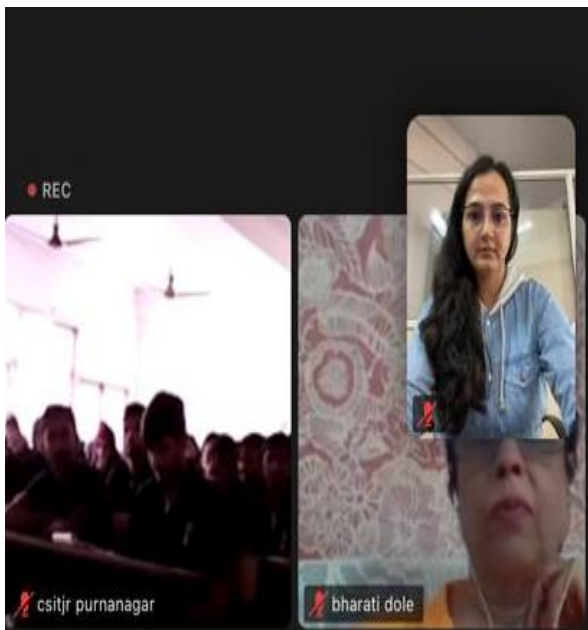

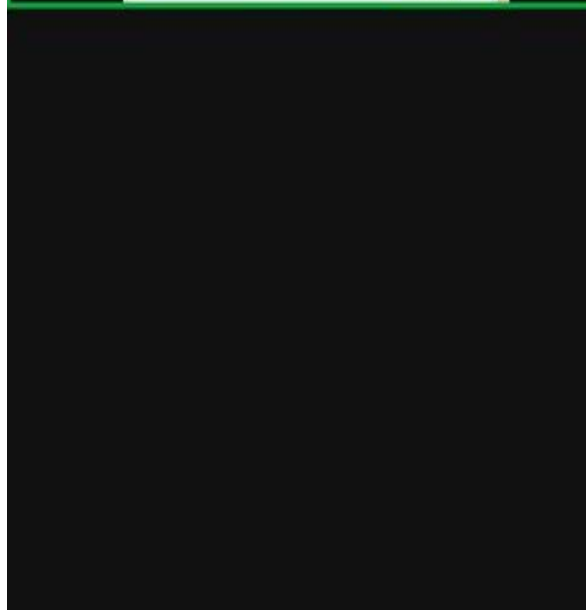
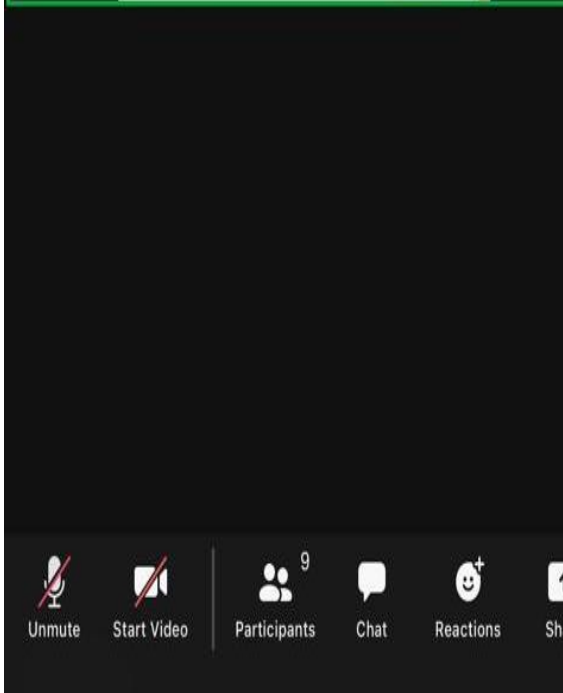
Copyright is a legal term describing **rights given to creators** for their **Literary, Artistic, Musical & Dramatic, Cinematographic works and sound recordings.**

## Geographical Indications;

- A geographical indication (GI) is a sign used on goods that have a specific geographical origin and possess qualities or a reputation that is solely due to the place of origin.
- A geographical indication (GI) is a name or sign used on certain products which corresponds to a specific geographical location or origin (e.g. a town, region, or country)
- Such goods enjoy an advantage over competing goods solely because of their geographical origin, which thus becomes a kind of IP and is protected.

## What is Patent ?

Patent is an Intellectual property right relating to inventions. It is an exclusive and monopoly right granted to the inventor by the government to use the patented invention for a limited period of time (20 Years) , thus preventing others from making, using, importing or selling in exchange of full disclosure of his invention.

### Basic requirements for getting patent

- 1) Novelty
- 2) Inventive Step
- 3) Industrial Applicability
