Introduction:

A Blood Donation Camp was organized by ASM's Institute of Professional Studies in collaboration with on 13th January 2025 at ASM's IPS. The initiative was undertaken to support the growing demand for safe blood and to raise awareness about the importance of voluntary blood donation in saving lives.

Objective:

- To encourage voluntary blood donation among students/staff/community members.
- To support hospitals and blood banks in maintaining a sufficient blood supply.
- To educate participants on the benefits and safety of donating blood.
- To foster a sense of social responsibility and community service.

Report:

The camp commenced at 11:00 a.m. with an opening address by Dr. Vikas Barbate, who emphasized the significance of blood donation. A team of certified medical professionals from Blood Bank managed the blood collection process with strict adherence to hygiene and safety protocols.

Participants underwent a basic health screening before donation. Refreshments and a certificate of appreciation were provided to each donor as a token of gratitude.

The camp saw enthusiastic participation from students, faculty, staff, and local residents. A total of 48 individuals registered for donation, out of which 39 were found eligible and successfully donated blood.
