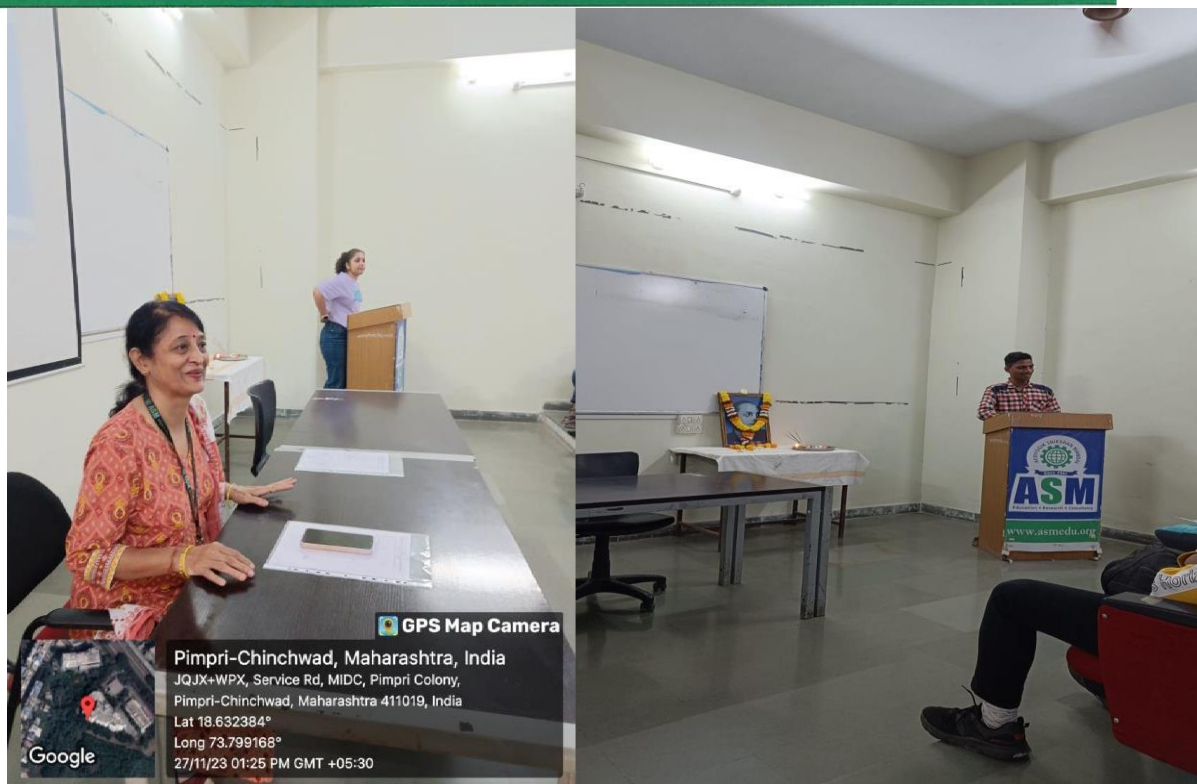
Then one of our fellow student gave a speech about Constitution Day and point out various important part of it.
