Introduction:

The Constitution Day celebration at ASM Institute of Professional Studies (ASM's IPS) on **26 November 2025** was organized to honour one of the most significant milestones in the history of independent India—the adoption of the Indian Constitution. Constitution Day, also known as *Samvidhan Diwas*, commemorates the day in 1949 when the Constituent Assembly of India adopted the country's supreme legal document, which came into effect on 26 January 1950.

The program was graced by **Dr. Sudhakar Bokephode**, Director, ASM's IPS, as the **Resource Person**.

The activity was organized under the guidance of the **IPS Social Club**, with coordination support from faculty members. The event was held in the presence of **Dr. Vikas Barbate (Dean, IPS)**. This day serves as a tribute to the vision of Dr. B. R. Ambedkar, the principal architect of the Constitution, and the dedicated members of the Constituent Assembly who worked tirelessly to build a framework that upholds justice, liberty, equality and fraternity in keeping with this spirit, ASM's IPS organized an informative and inspiring event to educate students about constitutional values, democratic principles, and the responsibilities of every citizen. The celebration aimed to

help students understand the importance of the Constitution not just as a legal text, but as a guiding force that shapes the nation's identity, governance, and future.

Objective:

- To create awareness about the significance of the Indian Constitution.
- To understand the contributions of Dr. B. R. Ambedkar and the Constituent Assembly.
- To encourage students to know their Fundamental Rights and Fundamental Duties.
- To promote democratic values, equality, liberty, justice, and fraternity.
- To inspire youth to become responsible and active citizens.

Report:

The Constitution Day celebration at ASM Institute of Professional Studies on 26 November 2025 was conducted with great enthusiasm and respect for the nation's democratic values. Students and faculty gathered to remember the adoption of the Indian Constitution and to understand its importance in shaping the identity and functioning of the country. The event began with a warm introduction by the IPS Social Club, after which the respected Resource Person, Dr. Sudhakar Bokephode, Director of ASM's IPS, delivered an insightful address on *"Indian Constitution and Responsibility"*.

In his session, Dr. Bokephode highlighted that the Constitution of India, adopted on 26 November 1949, is not merely a legal document but a vision and guiding framework that reflects the dreams of freedom fighters and the aspirations of every Indian for justice, equality, liberty, and fraternity. He elaborated on the immense contributions of Dr. B. R. Ambedkar, describing the Constitution as both flexible and strong—capable of adapting to social changes while protecting the rights of citizens. He reminded students that the Indian Constitution is the world's longest written constitution and represents the unity and diversity of the nation.

A major emphasis of his talk was the balance between Fundamental Rights and Fundamental Duties. While the Constitution grants citizens' rights such as equality before the law, freedom of speech, and the right to education, it also expects them to perform certain duties essential for national harmony. Dr. Bokephode explained key responsibilities including respecting the Constitution, the National Flag, and the National Anthem; promoting harmony and brotherhood; protecting public property; safeguarding the environment; and developing a scientific temper. He also spoke about the role of citizens in strengthening democracy by standing against corruption, combating discrimination, respecting the rule of law, and participating actively through actions like voting and following civic rules

Dr. Bokephode stressed that nation-building begins with individual actions—whether at home, in the classroom, or within society. He highlighted that responsible citizenship is not limited to large contributions but is reflected in everyday behavior, respect for others, and maintaining discipline. He encouraged students to uphold the dignity of others, contribute positively to the community, and strive to build an inclusive and progressive India as envisioned by the makers of the Constitution. The event also included the collective reading of the **Preamble**, where students and faculty reaffirmed their commitment to embodying constitutional values in their lives. A few students' shared thoughtful speeches and reflections inspired by the Constitution and the responsibilities of citizens in modern India. The event concluded with a heartfelt vote of thanks, acknowledging the contributions of the resource person, the chief patrons, faculty members, and the enthusiastic participation of students. The celebration successfully deepened students' understanding of the Indian Constitution and inspired them to act as responsible, aware, and values-driven citizens.
